**Item 2. Minutes of Meeting held on 7<sup>th</sup> March 2013 and Matters Arising**

Geoff Marks requested that item 7 amended to read “transparency” not “confidentiality”.

Councillor Dibbs on behalf of Rushmoor BC, reported that NO<sup>2</sup> is monitored.

Jenny Radley suggested that there should be an annual performance monitoring report on infringements presented annually at the March meeting and circulated to members on request.

***Action: TAG to incorporate the Infringement Summary Table from the previous Annual Performance Monitoring Report in to the March FACC report each year.***

The Chairman reported that he had been in contact with the Department of Transport regarding attendance at future meetings but had received no reply. He will continue the quest.

Geoff Marks will continue to work with the Chairman regarding a report to a future meeting on the concern about the consultation/notification on the recent PSZ review.

### **Item 3. TAG Information Report**

Brandon O'Reilly advised members that movements for June this year were similar to last year although weekend movements were fewer. TAG has acquired a new fire and rescue vehicle and has purchased the Meadowgate building. It is proposed that administration activities will be moved to this building with a new access from the roundabout allowing refurbishment of the Terminal building with more crew and passenger facilities. Farnborough International will be applying for permission for permanent chalets on the display site. Proposals for the RAF station at Northolt to increase business movements are likely following public consultation. Farnborough is now a designated airport for cats, dogs and ferrets and has received the award from Aviation International News as the best international business facility.

### **Item 4. TAG Reports**

Jenny Radley drew the Committee's attention to increased complaints from residents in the Church Crookham area and hoped that the air space change proposal would address this.

### **Item 5. Air Space Change Proposal**

The Committee received a presentation by NATS who stressed that the emphasis of the proposals is to improve airspace efficiency and maximise benefits for safety and environmental concerns.

Progress reports will be circulated, in June/July with a view to starting a wider consultation from 26<sup>th</sup> September to 20<sup>th</sup> December. FACC members will receive advance notice. Information will be available on the TAG website and there will be a formal submission to the Director of Airspace Policy early next year. NATS are very keen to engage with local people as widely as possible. Roger Walker stressed that he was keen that documents should be as easily understandable as possible but stressed that no maps have yet been produced. He will give a monthly update on the TAG and FACC websites. TAG will be happy to attend local meetings and are keen to solicit as many views as possible. FACC has been invited to suggest how this can be achieved.

#### ***Actions:***

- 1. All FACC members to contact TAG to suggest how best to involve local organisations and individuals.***
- 2. TAG to provide monthly updates.***

Councillor Dibbs referred to the need for consultation with RBC planners.

**Item 6. Questions from Members of the Public**

A Crondall resident welcomed the consultation on the airspace change proposals and asked how information would be made available. He was advised that information would be in the local council offices, libraries, public meetings and through websites and letters to local residents.

**Item 7. Matters Raised by the Committee not on the Agenda**

In answer to the question posed by James Radley TAG advised that he has now been provided with all CAA data that is available, but that does not include mean weight.

Norman Lambert requested a copy of the CAA data provided to James Radley.

*Action: TAG to provide Norman Lambert with information.*

In answer to members' questions TAG advised that so far as royal and diplomatic flights are concerned information is based on 2011 data but forecasts will be kept up to date as circumstances change, and stressed that crash rates are not a TAG responsibility and are not included in information provided to CAA.
