**Item 2. Minutes of Meeting held on 22<sup>nd</sup> Feb 2018 and Matters Arising**

The minutes were agreed as a correct record. There were no matters arising.

**Item 3. TAG Information Reports**

Brandon O'Reilly reported that the air traffic movements in the period January to May were up 17%. This was due, in part, to uncertainties at Northholt, increased reluctance of airports to accommodate business aircraft, the Brexit effect and the excellent and unique services provided at Farnborough.

The increase continues with movements in June up 19% compared with last year and 188 movements in one day being the best on record. The airfield remains number one in

Europe and 12<sup>th</sup> in the world.

TAG continues to be represented at shows in Geneva and Shanghai.  
The twilight run was a great success with £7380 raised for local charities.

Brandon was delighted to announce that Gulfstream will be building its maintenance, repair and overhaul facility on the airfield. The aim is to have the facility operational in 2020.

**Item 4. TAG Reports.**

Miles Thomas presented his report and drew the committee's attention to the very low number of complaints. The recent climatic conditions with predominantly easterly winds had resulted in greater use of the SW/NE runway for landings and take offs.

Miles was delighted to report that Farnborough airport has achieved Carbon Neutral status through Airport Carbon Accreditation and is the first business airport in the world to achieve this. The committee applauded this achievement.

The committee noted that under new Global Data Protection Regulations complainants details can no longer be shared or published. Concern was expressed that this will prove a problem for local representatives on the committee.
